As spring continues to unfurl and we look forward in anticipation of continued gains in the battle against COVID-19 and the restoration of our church building, I wanted to give you a progress report on the work being done.

Our newest Trustee, Matt Mood, has graciously agreed to be our primary contact with the general contractor, Yoder Construction. Inside work began the week of April 12 and the stone mason is expected to be on the job the week of April 19.

We also are looking to upgrade the outside sign to an electronic digital sign. Several the tables and chairs were

damaged and so replacements are being ordered.

We were very fortunate to find a contractor that could get on the job so quickly and

they have committed to staying on the job to get everything done as soon as possible.

Now for a quick look at our standing on the 2021 budget: At the end of March our offerings and other receipts total \$50,308; compared to \$43,382 last year. That increase has helped to limit the March 31 deficit to \$3,123 compared to \$10,010 in 2020. Thank you for your con-

tinued good stewardship.

As for our return to indoor worship services. Pastor Michael and the Ministry Team have assessed the survey responses and the county statistical data available. We have set May 2 as our target date to return to the sanctuary. We will again be roping off the pews to accommodate appropriate distancing and will require masks to ensure the safest environment for everyone.

Please continue to pray for an end to this deadly virus.
