This week all congregations in Mosaic Conference are praying for the 17 missionaries, including children, who were kidnapped in Haiti over a month ago. The missionaries are from an Anabaptist mission agency, Christian Aid Ministries, in Ohio. The agency specifically encourages prayers for endurance for the hostages, courage for the families of the hostages, wisdom for the government officials working on the release, and God's presence to the kidnappers. On **Nov. 24** Juan Marrero, executive director of Crossroads Community Center, will bring the message at Line Lexington Mennonite Church for their 6:30 pm **Thanksgiving Eve Service**. ACTION ALERT: Support global COVID-19 vaccine production.

Scripture reminds us to be steadfast in doing good: "So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvesttime, if we do not give up." (Galatians 6:9) The COVID-19 pandemic continues to cause enormous devastation. To date, 52% of the world's population has received at least one dose of the vaccine, while only 4% of people in low-income countries have received at least one dose. Join MCC's Washington Office in asking senators to support the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) that calls for the reallocation of \$98 million in funding to support global vaccine production capacity.
